### PRESIDENTS MESSAGE

**HELLO FROM THE PRESIDENT: January 2026**

We are now more than halfway through our bowls season and more than three-quarters of the way through a 2-year Board of Management term. The AGM will be held on the 31<sup>st</sup> May and I think it is appropriate to tell members that I will not be continuing after the AGM. It is vital that we try and get someone to consider a BOM position. I have had no luck when speaking to anyone regarding the Presidents position. It is quite concerning.

It has been a privilege to serve the club in this capacity, and I remain very committed to seeing it continue to thrive. With that in mind, I wanted to give members plenty of notice and encourage anyone who may be interested in the role of President to start considering this over the coming weeks. The position of President plays an important part in providing leadership and continuity for the club and I am happy to talk with anyone who might like to explore the role. As you know I volunteered to take this role on nearly two years ago because there were no nominations for the position then and it would be disappointing if this becomes an issue this time. I personally think the club must have someone in the President's role.

I encourage members to reflect on how they might contribute to the club's future, whether by nominating for a role on the Board or by supporting someone who may be willing to do so. Lesley Carey has been on the Board for several years and Bowls Manager 3 years after doing this role for 2 years prior to that. She will not be continuing and her position will also be up for nomination.

If you want the Club Holdfast to continue, we need members to step up, the lady members of the club have indeed done their share of keeping the club running. This is the year for a man to become our leader!

#### **MBA President's meeting – Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> January**

I attended the above meeting. It does appear that there is no sympathy within the bowls community for any clubs in our situation. We just have to wait and be relegated into Div 2 next year. I did also ask if we pulled out of Pennants on a Saturday and ran social bowls with good prize money, would that be held against the Club and not allow us to play Thursdays and Wednesdays. We can do that apparently and maybe this should be considered, particularly if

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we offered a lot more prize money i.e. \$200 for pairs winners and \$100 for second. Social bowls would be popular with many players, particularly the older pennant players who have had enough of pennant bowls. Something to think about!

### **Election Time in March**

The club has been approached to provide our dining room and attached rooms to the Electoral Commission for Pre-voting prior to the 21<sup>st</sup> March (Election Day).

Bowls will be over for our club at that time, unless by some miracle one of our teams make the finals! – they will be hiring the club from 10<sup>th</sup> March to the 24<sup>th</sup> March. The club will be receiving quite significant rent during that time which is something hard to ignore, financially this money is needed.

No member will be able to access the dining room or locker rooms, toilets or kitchen during that time. The rest of the club will be available as usual. Members will have to get their bowls or anything they may need from their lockers prior to the 10<sup>th</sup> March – **no exceptions**.

**The only disruption to members will be access to the dining room, locker rooms and kitchen. Anything you need in your locker will need to be picked up prior to the 10<sup>th</sup> March. If you do not need your bowls, etc they can be left in your locker. If so, you will not be able to get them so give it some thought.**

Night owls and club events will continue in the bar area. Obviously, bowls and mats and jacks will be moved to the bar area temporarily during that time.

### **Living Choice/Holdfast Council**

I rang Bob Paton, our local councillor, to see when Council would be addressing the Living Choice Proposal. He is supportive and after a long discussion about our club's situation

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decided to speak with the CEO. They have now decided to form a Working Group to address the proposal. It will be on the agenda for the next Council Meeting at the end of January.

I have now received a call from Pamela Jackson CEO of Holdfast Council. The Council did consider the proposal at their meeting Tuesday night and have decided not to proceed with the proposal at this time. While the council acknowledges the merits of the proposal, they recognise it needs to undertake a review of its entire property portfolio before making any long-term decisions about a particular site. This is underway, but not yet complete and as such the Council is of the view that work must be completed and considered by Council.

Obviously, this is not the outcome we were looking for but understand the Council do need to look at their property portfolio before making a decision.

Thanks to the generous support of Mark Murphy the club has a new Heatlie BBQ for use by the club and functions. Mark has been cooking BBQs for Night Owls and other club events and decided it was time for a new barbie.

### **GREEN MANAGER REPORT**

GREENS REPORT: BOM Meeting 27th January 2026

Croquet

Grooming has been completed and approximately 80 catches of grass removed.

The court has now been fertilised and a wetting agent applied.

There is some Fleabane weed and unfortunately I am unable to spray herbicide due to the hot weather. Once the weather is cooler I will attempt to eradicate this pest.

D Green is in great order: it has been fertilised and treated for fungicide.

B Green is also in great condition. Great coverage. 2 patches knitted over and very healthy.

A Green has been scarified and groomed and has had fertilisation and fungicide treatment and the end is almost covered over.

Automation of greens

A & B greens are automated irrigation.

D and Croquet are not automated and therefore I have to manually turn the irrigation on. I would like to investigate automation and have been in contact with a pump specialist to discuss this with the end result to have D green and Croquet fully automated which will void me of attending the site to manually turn on the irrigation. The ideal is to achieve a fully automated system through WiFi on my phone.

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
